# **Archives 2006**

A summary list of new accessions  
In Derbyshire Record Office

## **Introduction**

2006 saw the addition to archives available to the public in Derbyshire Record Office of over 400 new series. These included documents of all types from official records of the county of Derbyshire and city of Derby to personal records of individuals. The dates of new accessions spanned several hundred years – from the 16<sup>th</sup> to the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Although all these new documents relate to Derby and Derbyshire, many had strayed some distance from their places of origin. It is particularly gratifying to note the number of accessions from new sources because it demonstrates greater awareness of Derbyshire Record Office and its services.

Estate and family papers have seen many additions during the course of the year. One of the most important comprises the estate records of the Sitwells of Renishaw (D6573) which include a very good series of estate accounts from the late eighteenth century. A fine large scale map dated 1723 of the estate of the Rodes family at Barlborough was a very welcome gift (D6623). Travel diaries, 1864-1893, of George Henry Strutt documenting his visits to Europe, and including an account of an earthquake in the Alps, are a significant addition to the estate papers of the family of the Strutts of Belper (D6591).

We were particularly pleased to be given a 18<sup>th</sup> century commonplace book of Titus Wheatcroft of Ashover (D5775), Parish clerk like his father Leonard before him, Titus was a man of serious literary and educational interests and the volume completes a series of his memoranda and commonplace books, of interest for their insights into 18<sup>th</sup> century thought and attitudes. Similarly, the notebooks concerning Mugginton parish and village kept by the local schoolmaster, John Hind, between 1830 and 1869 are very revealing of rural life in mid Derbyshire the early Victorian period (D6658). For the early 20<sup>th</sup> century an unusual survival is the series of memoranda books kept by J F Russ, a

coalminer in Barlborough. He records national, as well as local events, and his choice of subjects very much shows the sense of community shared by miners and an awareness of risks in very dangerous employment where accidents and even disasters could occur at any time (D6668).

The range and diversity of personal papers is also noteworthy. These include the papers and manuscripts of Crichton Porteous, (1901-1991), journalist, environmentalist and writer on country life (D6550), and the research papers of a distinguished writer and historian of the Peak District, especially of Buxton, Dr Mike Langham (D6710). We have also been given published articles and papers of Phillip Whitehead, MEP, a long-time friend of Derbyshire Record Office (D6580). As a landlocked county, Derbyshire has few records relating to the sea and seafarers and so the personal papers of Nellie Hodgkins, a stewardess on Cunard Line ships including the *Queen Mary* and the *Queen Elizabeth II* from the 1920s to the 1960s are both interesting in themselves and of special value in documenting a woman's career in the merchant marine ((D6719).

In the early 1970s, Derbyshire found itself in national headlines because of the 'rent revolt' by a group of local councillors in North East Derbyshire who became known as the 'Clay Cross rebels'. They refused to implement fair rents regulations brought in by the Heath government and were eventually disqualified for a time from holding public office. One of the protagonists has now donated his very extensive archive of the rent revolt to the Record Office and it will prove a rich resource for present and future historians of the period (D6686).

As in previous years, In terms of quantity, probably the largest acquisition of new archives by type relates to nonconformist churches and chapels. Amalgamation of congregations, closure of chapels, and changes of personnel have all prompted transfer of such archives for safekeeping and use by researchers. Methodist organisations strongly represented in 2006 include chapels in Ashover (D6599), Blackwell (D4582), Brampton Moor (D6503), Buxton London Road (D6635), Chesterfield: Marsden St. (D3742), Old Hall Road (D3751), St John's Road (D6472), Sheffield Rd. (D3754), Storrs Rd. (D3757) and Wesley Hall (D3753), Chinley (D6609), Creswell Elmtton Road (D6608), Cromford (D6665), Cutthorpe (D6673), Hasland (D6516 add), Holloway (D4023 add),

Holmewood (D3760),Holymoorside (D6674),Holywell Cross (D3743),Ilkeston Nottingham Rd (D3946),Littlemoor (D6678), Loundsley Green (D6675),Newbold (D6676),New Whittington (D3758),Nottingham and Derby District of Methodist Church: (D5315 ),New Selston (D4396),Old Whittington Mount Tabor (D3749), Tibshelf (D5585),Wadshelf (D6678),Whaley Bridge (D6237),Whitehough (D6245),Wirksworth Bede Memorial (D3754), Bolehill (D4027),Ebenezer (D4012),The Dale (D4011),Methodist Circuit (D3008) and Methodist Church (D4014).

As Diocesan Record Office for the Diocese of Derby, we have also received many series of ecclesiastical parish records from throughout the county. These mostly comprise additional registers of baptisms, marriages and burials - for example, of Brampton St Thomas from 1908 (D2443 add) - but increasingly papers relating to social and community groups are also being deposited. We are also pleased to have received records of church furniture and fittings compiled by local groups, such as that for Beeley St Anne (D5625). One unusual item was a combined farm and parish account book for the mid to late 18<sup>th</sup> century for Mickleover kept by the Bryer family who held parish office during this period (D6562). Many researchers have consulted the series of watercolours of Derbyshire churches commissioned by Archdeacon Butler in the 1820s and so it will be of particular interest that a small group of drawings of North Derbyshire churches by the Swiss émigré Samuel Hieronymus Grimm dating from 1785 has been added to the collections here (D6700). These comprise views of parish churches in Ault Hucknall, Beighton, Dronfield and South Wingfield. (D6700).

Holdings of civil parish records have also been strengthened by accessions from Codnor (D6633), Cromford (D6685), Duffield (D1471), Elvaston (D6544), Etwall (D6692), Eyam (D2911), Horsley Woodhouse (D6654), Kilburn (D3495), Markeaton (D6610), Marston Montgomery (D6607), Newton Solney (D6680), Smisby (D6717), Turnditch (D6716) and Weston Underwood (D6626).

Early school log books are often an invaluable source of information about local communities and so it is pleasing to report that a significant number of volumes dating from the 19<sup>th</sup> century has been added to Record Office collections. Schools concerned include Chellaston Infants (D6592), Creswell Infants and Creswell

National (D6542), Derby St James (D6560) and Shirebrook new Boards School Mixed Dept (D6625). In addition, much 20<sup>th</sup> century material from other schools has been transferred during the past year.

Business records continue to be a particular strength of the Record Office's collections and new accessions this year have added to the Office's resources in this area. A former large-scale employer within the county is represented in a good series of photographs from Derby Locomotive Works (D6603). Transport is also documented in minutes of East Midlands Airport, 1970s to 1980s (D6541). For an earlier period, accounts, 1779-1826, of John Smith and Sons, hatters, of Bakewell are of particular interest for the light they shed on overseas trade at this time (D6586) and these are complemented by accounts, 1794-1833 of another Bakewell business, that of John Riddiard, maltster and miller (D6586/1-2).

Leadmining, another long established extractive industry in Derbyshire is represented by means of new archives relating to Brassington (D6546) and Middleton by Wirksworth (D6694). Colliery disasters were not uncommon in the past, but documentation can sometimes be very limited. Therefore, we were pleased to receive disaster reports for the explosion at Markham Colliery, near Bolsover, in 1973 (D6628). On a happier note, reminiscences of a Derbyshire coalminer in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century shed light on a now vanished way of life (D6621). Sale particulars can be especially informative for local history and so an early 20<sup>th</sup> century series from Andrew Macbeth, Cash & Co of Wirksworth was welcome. (D6696)

It is relatively uncommon for further manorial records to come to light, and so we were delighted to receive court books for Shirland Manor, 1812-1933 (D6627).

Local groups and societies cover a very wide range of activities. Matlock Embroiderers' Guild (D6231), New Mills Natural History Society (D5520), Swanwick Writers' Summer School (D5886) Derbyshire Women's Hockey Association (D6695), Ashover Working Men's Institution (D6687), Bakewell Choral Society (D6587) and Stanley Allotment Association (D6589) are just some examples of organisations which have added archival records to our collections. Archives of two teachers' unions have augmented

our holdings of records of professional associations. These are the minutes of the Derbyshire Schoolmasters Association, 1966-1974 (D6713) and of the North East Derbyshire Schoolteachers' Association, 19234-1991 (D6712).

Derbyshire County Council's Record Office is the archive office for the county of Derbyshire, city of Derby and diocese of Derby. It is legally appointed to hold and make available to the public archives of all types - official, ecclesiastical, business, family, societies, schools, hospitals, industries, and so on – of Derbyshire origin from the Middle Ages to the present day. Under joint arrangements with Derby City Council, all the professional services and facilities provided by Derbyshire Record Office are available to individuals and institutions within the city of Derby as well as within the county of Derbyshire. New archives come into Derbyshire Record Office in Matlock every week. The majority of these are from new sources, often identified by Record Office surveys and field work, whilst others are additions to series already in our custody.

The purpose of ***Archives 2006*** is to provide an initial guide to acquisitions during that year by giving brief information about the type of archival material, its covering dates and the Derbyshire Record Office reference number. Fuller details of each archive are available for reference in the catalogues in the Record Office Search Room in New St., Matlock, where original documents, if not undergoing conservation treatment or subject to closure periods, can also be consulted. Some catalogues are also now available electronically, for example, on the Record Office website [www.derbyshire.gov.uk/recordoffice](http://www.derbyshire.gov.uk/recordoffice) and on the Public Record Office's Access to Archives website, [ww.a2a.org.uk](http://ww.a2a.org.uk).

### ***What archives can I find in Derbyshire Record Office?***

The core series of archives in Derbyshire Record Office are here because they are protected by legislation which requires their safe preservation. In addition, official bodies have a responsibility to ensure records are preserved as evidence to the public of their activities.

Derbyshire Record Office is appointed by the Lord Chancellor as the place of deposit for public records of Derbyshire under the

Public Records Acts. The Master of the Rolls has also appointed the Record Office to hold tithe and manorial records from throughout Derbyshire. The Bishop of Derby has appointed the office as the Diocesan Record Office. Derbyshire Record Office also has the legal power to accept Derbyshire archives from private owners and creators of records.

Derbyshire Record Office accepts records under the terms of its published acquisition policy. Criteria include requirements that original documents must be of Derbyshire origin and, in accordance with national guidelines, be identified by archivists as appropriate for permanent preservation. Accessions of new archives are listed by professional archivist staff, receive conservation treatment where necessary and are stored in secure, temperature- and humidity-controlled environments which meet the *British Standard for Storage and Exhibition of Archival Documents (BS5454)*.

### ***How do records come into Derbyshire Record Office?***

An important source of archive acquisitions is the programme of surveys and inspections of records undertaken by archivist staff. Some inspections are required by law. For example, amongst the series of records which are transferred into the custody of the Record Office as the result of statutory requirements are the non-current registers of Church of England parishes throughout the county. These are inspected at intervals under the *Parochial Register and Records Measure*. Implementation of these programmes has led to many registers and other series of records coming into the custody of the Record Office where they are accessible to researchers and where their safekeeping is assured into the future. Almost all the historic registers of ancient parishes are now safely transferred; additions to the holdings are made as more recent registers are completed and pass out of current use.

### ***How does Derbyshire Record Office make sure important records in the county and city are not lost or destroyed inadvertently?***

Derbyshire Record Office is pro-active in ensuring the preservation of archives at risk of loss or destruction. Closure of long-established local businesses; changes of premises of churches or schools; hospitals becoming redundant; house clearances after the

deaths of parents or relatives; restructuring in organisations; changes of officer in local societies or other associations – these are some of the many reasons which can lead to historical documents being lost if the Record Office were not to intervene.

We frequently find out about these risks from individuals and groups who contact us with information. Where appropriate, this is followed up by a visit from an archivist and collection, direct from the source, of archival documents. Derbyshire Record Office has its own transport and so can usually rescue records at short notice if necessary. Gifts of archives and bequests of documents, if agreed in advance with the Record Office, are also welcome.

### ***Are we adding the right archives to our collections?***

This list covers a very wide variety of types of archives, but are there others you think we should be acquiring? You may know of original historical documents which you feel should be amongst the Record Office's holdings. If so, we should like to know more about where they are and whom we should contact about them.
